## “GOING GREENER FOR THE LORD”

### INSIDE THIS ISSUE:

In keeping with the “Going Green” trend, Wesley Woods is making a conscious effort to reduce economic and environmental costs where ever possible.

One part of the effort, is infrastructure improvement, which includes the water and sewage systems. The equipment, supply lines, pressure, storage tanks and water safety are key ingredients to this very important, but seldom seen part of the camp. By upgrading the plumbing, and the primary and backup pumping equipment in our water system will ensure that our guests will reap the benefits of constant water pressure. The “On Demand” water heaters in each cabin will be an immediate savings to the camp and a much appreciated and improved amenity to our guests. Installing sewage grinding pumps that are more efficient and stronger will erase the problem of effluent leaking out of holding areas. A better water chlorination and holding systems will ensure that the water that staff and guests use is pure. Its important to note here that infrastructure improvement needs to be accomplished before the camp moves on with major buildings and renovations, such as a Gym, Pool Enclosure, Resident Hall, Welcoming Center, and Horse Arena.

The infrastructure improvement is only the beginning. Last year Wesley Woods started installing more insulation, better windows, and winterized certain parts of the camp that were used infrequently. We also replaced old furnaces with the newer efficient ones and over 900,000 cubic feet of gas was saved from this effort. The camp wants to continue with this so we can pass the savings too our guests, in rate stabilization and improved facilities that provide much more comfort, and be better stewards of our environment. Cosmetic and comfort improvements, such as siding, painting inside and out, better mattresses, and more efficient air conditioning will be another part of the “Going Greener for the Lord” campaign.

More subtle, but a very important part of the campaign is upgrading computer software and equipment so the use of paper becomes infrequent and the use of the internet becomes the norm. Using, Enews, Facebook, and email, can save a tremendous amount postage supplies throughout the year.

Recycling will be another area of “Going Greener for the Lord”. Specially marked containers will be available in more areas for our campers to dispose of their pop cans and plastic bottles. A cardboard bailer in the kitchen storage area will make Wesley Woods even more environmentally sound.

All of this comes at an expense. A preliminary estimate from the camp’s Maintenance Committee comes in at \$200,000. If you feel led to give to this extremely important venture, you can use the enclosed card on page 8, titled “Going Greener for the Lord”, and mail card and check to:

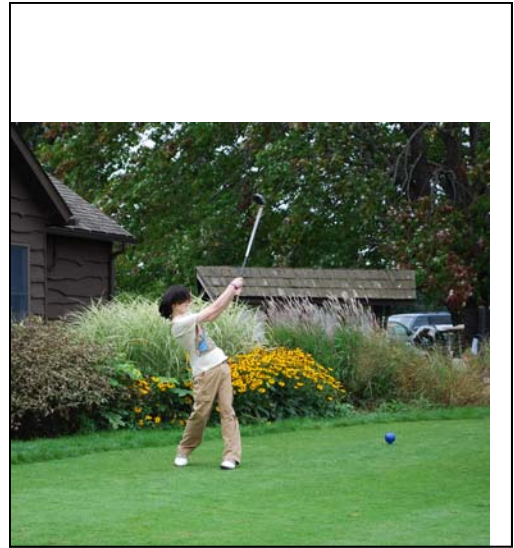

## Wesley's Famous Woodchuck Stew

1 T Olive Oil	2 Cans (app. 15oz) Tomato sauce
1 C Chopped onion	1 Can Tomato paste
2 Stalks celery chopped	½ C Hickory flavored BBQ sauce
1 ½ # Ground Pork	Salt and Pepper to taste
1 ½ # Ground Beef	Frank's hot sauce to taste
3 # Chicken Thighs	1 Green Pepper Chopped
1 32oz chicken broth	3 (14.5oz) cans of cream style corn
3 (14.5 oz) cans whole peeled tomatoes chopped/ liquid	½ # bag frozen Okra
	½ # bag frozen lima beans

1. Boil chicken thighs in broth, add enough water to cover.
2. Sauté onion, celery, and green pepper until soft, add ground pork and brown. Transfer mixture to stock pot.
3. Brown ground beef, drain, and add to stock pot
4. Shred cooked chicken and add to stock pot (reserve broth to thin stew as needed)
5. Add all other ingredients and simmer over low heat for 2 hours minimum.
